

Welcome to the Armstrong Forest Preserve The Armstrong Forest Preserve was donated to Five Rivers Conservation Trust in December. 2019 by Thomas Armstrong, who owned the land with his wife Rachel for 63 years. Five Rivers will manage this area as a natural area and encourage the public to explore the property and learn about the nature of this 24 acre forest. We are thankful to the whole Armstrong Family for this generous gift to Five Rivers and those who choose to use the land.

Location

The Preserve is located directly across from the Exit 3 ramp off of I89. This Ramp is only accessible to northbound traffic on 189.

Directions

From Concord: take I 89 North to Exit 3. Turn right onto Stickney Hill Road and park along the road, before reaching the first house.

From Hopkinton: Take I89 South to Exit 2 to I89 North to Exit 3. Turn right onto Stickney Hill Road and park along the road, before reaching the first house.

Parking

Park along Stickney Hill Road, and be sure to pull off to the side of the road.

The Armstrong Loop

The loop trail is about 1 mile long, including some walking along Stickney Hill Road and Millstone Drive, along two abandoned roads, Cross Road and Hart Road, and part of a St Pauls' School trail that takes hikers back to Stickney Hill Road. The Loop is about 1 mile long. Please be respectful of those who live near the Preserve.

Adjacent Trails

From the Armstrong Preserve, hikers can access the West End Farm Trail to Five Rivers' conserved Dimond Hill Farm and beyond by following the yellow arrow shown through the off ramp. See the map and description available at https://concordnh.gov/Facilities/Facility/ Details/78.

St Paul's School owns land east of the preserve that hosts additional trails shown with yellow arrows. In the winter, some of these trails are used by snowmobiles and cross country skiers.

Who is Five Rivers Conservation Trust?

Five Rivers is a non-profit conservation organization focused on conserving land in the greater capital regions. Since 1988, Five Rivers has conserved nearly 5000 acres, including the Armstrong Preserve, Maplewood Farm, Dimond Hill Farm, Carter Hill Orchard, and the Swope and Winant Parks in Concord. Many properties in Hopkinton, Dunbarton, Canterbury, Loudon, Gilmanton and other capital area towns are also conserved by Five Rivers.
